Assistant Chief Marcus Jones is a 33-year veteran of the department and currently oversees the Investigative Services Bureau. He has also served as the Commander of the 3rd District (Silver Spring), the Director of Major Crimes, Drug Enforcement Commander, the Police Training Academy Deputy Director and a variety of other assignments. Assistant Chief Jones is a graduate of the FBI National Academy Session #267. He is also a graduate of the FBI-LEEDA Executive Leadership and DEA Drug Commander Schools. Marcus was selected American Legion Police Officer of the Year in 1996 in the Southern Region of Maryland. He helped to create an award winning Diversity Training program for the Police Department which he teaches to each Academy class and led a team for the award winning Drug Market Initiative eliminating an open drug market in the county. Assistant Chief Jones is an adjunct instructor for the Leadership in Police Organizations three-week training course sponsored by the International Chiefs of Police. Assistant Chief Jones
