

CODEcamp is an independent “augmentative” education program conceived in collaboration with software companies in the Digital Corridor to teach a limited number of computer code classes in subject areas that are in high demand. Part of the inspiration for CODEcamp comes from the overwhelming success and popularity of efforts like codecademy and skillshare.

GOAL - CODEcamp’s objective is to train students in software development skills that are in high demand and can potentially result in immediate apprenticeships/employment.

AUDIENCE - CODEcamp is targeted to any person exhibiting a real aptitude, interest and passion to learn or expand their coding skills in high-demand technologies.

LOCATION - CODEcamp classes are taught at the Digital Corridor “Flagship2” business incubator at 78 Alexander Street.

COURSE OFFERINGS - The initial course offerings are – Introduction to Ruby on Rails, Django/Python, jQuery, and iOS

INSTRUCTORS - CODEcamp is taught by experienced professionals in the Charleston Digital Corridor’s software development community.

INSTRUCTION SCHEDULE - CODEcamp classes are held from Monday to Thursday from 6-7:30pm.

COURSE DURATION - CODEcamp’s classes are all 12 weeks.

COST: The fee is \$500 per class per student.

CLASS COMPLETION - Individuals who successfully complete the relevant coursework will receive a Certificate of Completion for the respective class.

SPONSORS - CODEcamp is supported by the Charleston Digital Corridor Foundation that provides the facilities and equipment for the program. The classroom is equipped with iMacs and relevant software required for each course.
