Mayor Tecklenburg and Latinx Advisory Council Announce National Hispanic Heritage Month, Charleston Observance, Events

Charleston, S.C. — Charleston Mayor John Tecklenburg and the Mayor’s Latinx Advisory Council announced the city’s National Hispanic Heritage Month 2022 observances at a press conference Thursday.

“The Latinx Advisory Council has done an outstanding job of producing this year’s Hispanic Heritage Month calendar of events, in collaboration with the City’s Cultural Affairs Department,” Mayor Tecklenburg said. “Thanks to these efforts, this year’s calendar is twice as large as last year’s calendar.”

Latinx Advisory Councilmember Nilsy Rapolo provided a Spanish interpretation of Mayor Tecklenburg’s opening statement. Representatives from organizations that sponsor more than 40 Hispanic Heritage Month events also attended the press conference.

In a proclamation reading, Mayor Tecklenburg announced September 15 – October 15 as “National Hispanic Heritage Month” in the city, aligning with the national observance (proclamation attached).

The U.S. began recognizing National Hispanic Heritage Week in 1968 under President Lyndon B. Johnson. On August 17, 1988, President Ronald Reagan expanded the celebration to a month-long recognition by enacting National Hispanic Heritage Month into federal law.
