

John Edwards, 1760-1798

1760	Born to John Edwards and Margaret Peronneau
ca. 1780-1782	Served as captain and aide-de-camp to General Francis Marion
1781	Imprisoned on the British ship the <i>Schooner Pack Horse</i>
1783	Married Rebecca Donnom (d. 1798)
1783-1784	Served as City tax inquirer and collector
1785-1798	Served as secretary of the Charleston Chamber of Commerce
1787	Represented St. Philip's and St. Michael's parishes in the General Assembly
1787-1788	Served as a Commissioner of the State Treasury
1791-1794	Reelected to the General Assembly representing St. Philip's and St. Michael's parishes
ca. 1793-1798	Served as director of the Bank of South Carolina
1794-1795	Elected warden for ward 5 and served as intendant pro tem
1795-1797	Served two terms as intendant of the City of Charleston
1798	Death and burial at Circular Congregational Church
