

## John Dawson, Jr., Time Line, 1765-1823

1765	Born to Joanna Broughton Monck Dawson and John Dawson, Sr., Esq., an immigrant from Westmoreland, England
1789	Married Mary Shubrick Huger (d. 1823), daughter of Charleston's sixth intendant, John Huger, with whom he had twelve children
1800-1808	Represented St. Philip and St. Michael's parishes in the South Carolina House of Representatives
1801-1809	Served on the Board of Directors of the State Bank of South Carolina
1811-1823	Cashier of the State Bank of South Carolina
1802-1803	Warden of Charleston's 2 <sup>nd</sup> Ward
1806-1808	Intendant of the City of Charleston
1808	Promoted to captain in the South Carolina Militia
ca. 1809-1823	Served on the Board of Commissioners for the Charleston Orphan House
1823	Death and burial at the Cathedral Church of St. Luke and St. Paul
