With development beginning in the 1920s, Riverland Terrace was James Island's first true neighborhood and boasts some of the area's most architecturally significant homes as well as natural beauty in our grand oaks and waterfront vistas. The Riverland Terrace Neighborhood Association was formally established in 1992 and strives to be a liaison between our residents, community groups, and governmental organizations to help keep this area safe, clean, and beautiful.



While a formal HOA does not exist, the neighborhood association fills the role of organizing events, disseminating helpful information, advocating for grand tree preservation, fundraising, and being a voice for sensible area improvements/growth. The RTNA has reestablished memberships after a hiatus from Covid and have successfully worked with the county to get some of our older roads resurfaced. The association also has groups of residents who take part in subcommittees based on specific objectives.
