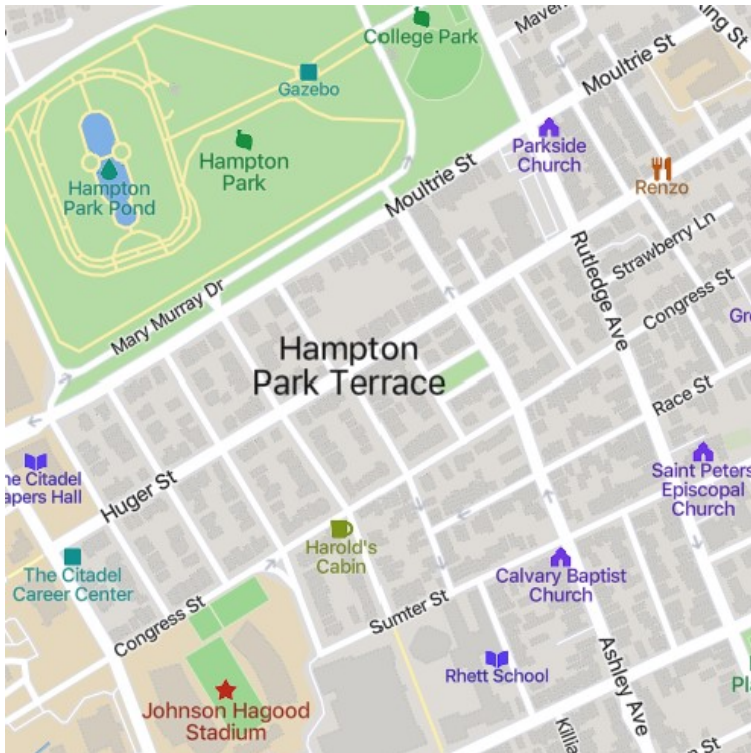


# Hampton Park Terrace

Hampton Park Terrace (HPT) is the neighborhood is bounded on the west by The Citadel, on the north by Hampton Park, on the east by Rutledge Ave., and on the south by Congress St. In addition, the one block of Parkwood Ave. south of Congress St. is considered, by some, to be included. Over the last 2 years, the neighborhood has resumed its bi-monthly association meetings where neighbors can learn about local Charleston affairs and neighborhood updates. The meetings are scheduled for the third Tuesday of every other month starting in January. We meet at 7 p.m. at the First Church of Christ, Scientist located at 137 Moultrie Street.



Within the last year, HPT hosted a Tour of Homes, where six to eight of our neighbors opened their homes to guided tours that focused on the histories and eclectic interior designs. The proceeds of the tour allow HPT to host monthly neighborhood socials and plan for future events. Monthly socials over the past year have included Saturday morning donuts and coffee on the porch where children and adults gathered. Over the summer, an ice cream truck meandered HPT's streets and brought much joy on a very hot day. We also had a large neighborhood gathering in Allan Park over the summer where we invited our neighbors to picnic while listening to the Bluegrass Sounds of Dalleas. On October 1 HPT started its second annual "You've Been Booed" where neighbors secretly leave Halloween gifts at other neighbors' doors – it has been such a hit with young and old alike! Christmas will bring with it an afternoon of cookie decorating and caroling.
